(Purpose)

Article 1

1. The purpose of these regulations is to set forth necessary matters with regard to the degrees conferred by Rikkyo University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) in accordance with Article 104 (Paragraphs 1 through 4) of the School Education Act (Law No.26, 1947), the 1953 Degree Regulations (Ministry of Education, Science and Culture Order No. 9 of 1953), and the Rikkyo University Regulations and Rikkyo University Graduate School Regulations.

(Areas of Specialization)

Article 2

1. The names (degree tags) for areas of specialization for the undergraduate degrees conferred by the University's colleges and departments shall be as follows.

(Degree Conferment Requirements)

Article 3

1. The prescribed undergraduate degrees set forth in the preceding article shall be conferred upon persons who have graduated from the University, in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 (Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3) of the University Regulations.
2. The prescribed master's degrees set forth in the preceding article shall be conferred upon persons who have completed a master's program (or master's program as the initial phase of

- a two-phase doctoral program) at the University Graduate School, in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 (Paragraphs 1 and 2) of the University Graduate School Regulations.
3. The prescribed doctoral degrees set forth in the preceding article shall be conferred upon persons who have completed a doctoral program (the second phase of a two-phase doctoral program) at the University Graduate School, in accordance with the provisions of Article 6 (Paragraphs 1 through 4) of the University Graduate School Regulations.
 4. The prescribed doctoral degrees set forth in the preceding article may be conferred upon persons who have not completed a doctoral program (the second phase of a two-phase doctoral program) at the University Graduate School, in accordance with the provisions of Article 6 (Paragraph 5) of the University Graduate School Regulations.
 5. The prescribed degrees set forth in the preceding article shall be conferred upon persons who have completed a professional degree program at the University's Professional Graduate School, in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 (Paragraph 1) of the Rikkyo University Professional Graduate School regulations.

(Submission of Degree Theses)

Article 4

1. Degree application theses (hereinafter referred to “thesis” or “theses”) shall be submitted to the University President (hereinafter referred to as “the President”) in accordance with the provisions set forth by each graduate school.
2. When a person enrolled in a doctoral program at the University Graduate School applies for the conferment of a doctoral degree, they shall submit a thesis to the President along with a degree application form, a list or transcript of research results, a summary or abstract detailing the main portent of the thesis, a resume, and thesis review handling fees as stipulated separately.
3. When a person who has not completed a doctoral program at the University Graduate School applies for the conferment of a doctoral degree, they shall submit a thesis (specifying the name of the area of specialization for their desired degree) to the President along with a degree application form, a list or transcript of research results, a summary or abstract detailing the main portent of the thesis, a resume, and thesis review handling fees as stipulated separately.
4. When a person who has been enrolled on a doctoral program at the University Graduate School for a period of three (3) years or more—and has then withdrawn from the University Graduate School—applies for the conferment of a doctoral degree, they shall do so in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph.
5. When an application for the conferment of a degree fulfills the requirements of any one of the preceding four paragraphs, the President shall accept said application. As a general rule, once such an application has been accepted, it cannot be withdrawn.
6. Theses and thesis review handling fees submitted in accordance with Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 shall not be returned.
7. The provisions of these Regulations and Paragraph 1 of this article shall apply with regard to the “research outcomes in relation to a specific task/topic” provided for under Article 5 (Paragraph 2) of the University Graduate School Regulations.

(Theses)

Article 5

1. Each main thesis submitted in accordance with the provisions of the preceding article should have one main volume. As a general rule, in the case of a master's thesis, one copy should be submitted. In the case of a doctoral thesis, one PDF format copy and three book-bound copies should be submitted; provided, however, that students may also attach other theses for reference purposes.

2. When it is necessary in order to conduct a thesis review, the review committee may order the submission of other materials, including reference theses, thesis translations, models and samples, etc.

(Referral of Theses for Review)

Article 6

1. When a thesis has been accepted in accordance with the provisions of Article 4 (Paragraph 5) of these Regulations, the President shall refer said thesis to the graduate school committee for the relevant school for the degree being applied for, for review purposes.

(Review Committees)

Article 7

1. Upon referral of a thesis for review purposes in accordance with the provisions of the preceding article, the relevant graduate school committee shall establish a review committee comprising of three or more persons, including a member (or members) of teaching staff specializing in the relevant area of specialization for the degree being applied for.
2. Each review committee shall comprise of one chief reviewer and two or more deputy reviewers.
3. When a review committee deems it necessary to do so in order to conduct a thesis review, said review committee may, after discussion at a meeting of the relevant graduate school committee, add additional specialist teaching staff (with specialisms relating to the thesis in question) to its members as deputy reviewers.
4. The chief reviewer for each review committee shall be selected from amongst teaching staff belonging to the relevant degree program for the degree being applied for; provided, however, that separate provisions shall be stipulated in the case of degree programs for which recruitment has been halted.

(Thesis Reviews and Examinations)

Article 8

1. Review committees shall conduct thesis reviews and final examinations.
2. Final examinations shall comprise of examinations on the thesis and its related subject modules, as well as two types of foreign language (oral and written) examinations.
3. In the event that, as a result of a thesis review, the review committee finds the content of the thesis to be remarkably poor, the review committee shall not conduct final examinations.
4. In the case of reviews in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 (Paragraph 4) of these Regulations, aside from the requirements set forth under Paragraph 2 of this Article, the review committee must certify that the person in question possesses the same academic knowledge and ability as a person who has been awarded a degree after completing a doctoral program (the second phase of a two-phase doctoral program) in relation to specialist academic study.

(Exemption from Examinations)

Article 9

1. Persons applying for a degree in accordance with the provisions of Article 4 (Paragraphs 1, 2 and 4) of these Regulations are exempt from the foreign language examinations provided for under Paragraph 2 of the preceding article.

(Review Periods)

Article 10

1. Each review committee must complete all thesis reviews and final examinations by the prescribed deadline. In the case of a master's degree, the review committee must complete

thesis reviews and final examinations by the end of that semester. In the case of a doctoral degree under the Article 4 (paragraph 2), the review committee must complete thesis reviews and final examinations by the end of the year during which the degree application was accepted, and a doctoral degree under the Article 4 (paragraph 3 or 4), must complete within a year after the degree application was accepted; provided, however, that where special reasons exist with regard to a doctoral degree the review committee may, after discussion at a meeting of the relevant graduate school committee, extend the review and examination period up to a maximum of one year.

(Review Committee Reports)

Article 11

1. Upon the completion of the thesis review and final examinations pertaining to a particular degree application, the review committee's chief reviewer must promptly submit to the relevant graduate school committee a written report including a summary of the content of the thesis, a summary of the thesis review and final examination results, and his or her official opinion as to whether or not a degree should be conferred; provided, however, that where necessary the chief reviewer may request for one of the deputy reviewers to draft the document in his or her place.
2. Where the review committee has not conducted final examinations in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 (Paragraph 3) of these regulations, the review committee must report this fact to the relevant graduate school committee in writing.

(Graduate School Committee Deliberations)

Article 12

1. Based on reports submitted in accordance with the previous article, graduate school committees shall deliberate and, in the case of degree applications pursuant to Paragraphs 2 and 3 of Article 3 of these regulations determine based on the provisions of the University Graduate School Regulations whether or not a degree is to be conferred; or, in the case of degree applications pursuant to Paragraphs 4 of Article 3 of these regulations, determine whether or not the relevant applicant has passed or failed with regard to their thesis and final examinations, and whether or not a doctoral degree is to be conferred.
2. Decisions based on deliberations provided for under the preceding paragraph require at least two-thirds (2/3) of the committee members to be in attendance, and at least three-quarters (3/4) of the committee members in attendance must be in agreement; provided, however, that committee members who are unable to attend due to official business or business trips shall not be included in the count.

(Graduate School Committee Chairpersons' Reports)

Article 13

1. When a graduate school committee has reached a decision in accordance with the preceding article, the chairperson of said committee must submit to the President, together with the thesis itself, a written report including a summary of the content of the thesis, a summary of the thesis review and final examination results, and his or her official opinion as to whether or not a degree should be conferred.

Article 13-2 – Deleted

(Determination of Degree Conferment)

Article 14

1. Based on the report provided for under the preceding article, the President shall assemble the University Graduate School Committee and, after deliberation by the Committee, determine whether or not a degree is to be conferred.
2. Decisions made by the University Graduate School Committee as a result of the deliberations provided for under the preceding paragraph are subject to the provisions of Article 12 (Paragraph 2) of these Regulations.

(Conferment of Degrees)

Article 15

1. The President shall confer the prescribed degrees upon persons determined to be deserving of the conferment of such degrees based on the determinations (decisions) provided for under the preceding article; and shall notify persons for whom it has been found that conferment of a degree is not possible.

(Announcement of Degree Thesis Summaries/Abstracts, etc.)

Article 16

1. When a doctoral degree has been conferred, the University must publicly announce a summary or abstract of the content of the relevant degree thesis and a summary of the review findings within a period of three (3) months commencing from the date of the conferment of the degree, in accordance with the Rikkyo University Academic Repository.

(Announcement of Degree Theses)

Article 17

1. Persons who have been awarded a doctoral degree must publicly announce or present their degree thesis within a period of one (1) year commencing from the date of the conferment of the degree, in accordance with the Rikkyo University Academic Repository; provided, however, that this provision does not apply when the person in question has already announced or presented their thesis.
2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, in cases where there are unavoidable reasons to do so, and with the approval of the University, persons who have been awarded a doctoral degree may publicly announce or present a summarized version of the content of their degree thesis as a substitute for their full thesis. In such cases, the University shall supply the full, unabridged version of the thesis for viewing when requested.
3. When announcing the content of a degree thesis in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph, students must clearly indicate the fact that said thesis has been subjected to a review by Rikkyo University.

(Usage of Degree Names)

Article 18

1. When using the name of their degree, persons who have been awarded a degree by the University shall do so as follows, appending the name of the University to the front of the degree: Rikkyo University Bachelor of (...); Rikkyo University Master of (...); Rikkyo University Doctor of (...); Rikkyo University Juris Doctor; or as follows, appending the name of the University after the degree: Bachelor of (...), Rikkyo University; Master of (...), Rikkyo University; Doctor of (...), Rikkyo University; Juris Doctor, Rikkyo University.

(Revocation of Conferred Degrees)

Article 19

1. When a person who has been awarded with a degree by the University has committed some act that dishonors the good name of the University, or when it has been found that said

person obtained their degree through some fraudulent means, the President must, after discussion by the University Graduate School Committee, revoke said person's degree, order the return of the degree title, and publicly announce the fact of such revocation.

2. Decisions made under the preceding paragraph are subject to the provisions of Article 12 (Paragraph 2) of these Regulations.

(Registration)

Article 20

1. When the University has conferred a doctoral degree, the President must record details of the degree in the University's degree register; and must, within a period of three (3) months, submit a doctoral degree conferment report and using the format shown in Attachment 1, via E-mail, to the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.

(Format for Diplomas)

Article 21

1. Diplomas shall follow the format shown in Attachment 2.

Supplemental Provision

These regulations shall be enacted as of April 1, 1961.

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Part 5: Academic Affairs

Matters for Understanding and Consent in Relation to Article 3, Paragraph 4 of the Rikkyo University Degree Regulations

When the relevant graduate school committee deems there to be some special reason to do so, the University may exempt persons applying for degrees in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, Paragraph 4 of the Rikkyo University Degree regulations from the need to sit either or both of the two types of foreign language examinations.
